"Today's young workers are part of the largest generation to enter the workforce since the baby boomers," CWA Chief of Staff Ron Collins stated. "In the next 5 to 10 years, almost half of all current Union members, approximately 5 to 7 million workers, will retire. Youth unionization rates are two and a half times lower than those of workers aged 40 to 65. This is why organizing young workers and developing young leaders is critical for the future of CWA."
